Introduction and Background:


•	Worldview: A way of looking at reality; the basic					
	a person has about the world. A worldview is derived from people					
	experience of their social and physical environments, and					
	provides a more or less coherent way of thinking about the world.					
	It serves in turn as the cognitive basis for the people's					
	interaction with their social and physical environments (EDB).					
	It is the way you something;

•	The books of Luke and Acts form a two-volume biography of Jesus.					
	The first volume (Luke) relates to life and					
	ministry. The second volume relates to Jesus'					
	and the impact they make as they follow					
	his teaching.					
•	The Acts of the Apostles the early life in the					
	church as the gospel spreads from Jerusalem to the uttermost part					
	of the earth.					
•	In the first half of the book, the action primarily surrounds					
	and addresses the church in Jerusalem (Acts					
	1-11). In the second half of the book, the action primarily follows					
	and his ministry endeavors (Acts 12-28).					
•	Paul's first missionary journey with Barnabas begins from Antioch					
	(13:1-3). This journey continues through Cyprus, Pisidia Antioch,					
	Iconium, Lystra, Derbe and finishes back in Antioch (13:3-14:28).
